The Children's Life Fund Authority Announces New Board of Management

The Children's Life Fund Authority (CLFA) announces the appointment of its new Board of Management for a term of three (3) years, effective 24th October 2025. The Board of Management will be led by Chairman, Dr. Kevon Dindial.

Dr. Dindial is a consultant Paediatric Haematologist/Oncologist at the Eric Williams Medical Sciences Complex. Dr. Dindial has an MBBS (UWI-STA) and DM Paediatrics (UWI-STA). After completing his paediatric training, Dr. Dindial pursued a three-year clinical fellowship in paediatric haematology/oncology at the Hospital for Sick Children, SickKids, Canada. He is board-certified in paediatric haematology/oncology through the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and serves as the co-lead physician for the SickKids-Caribbean Initiative (SCI) in Trinidad and Tobago. Dr. Dindial also serves as a Council Member of the Medical Board of Trinidad and Tobago (MBTT) and is a member of the National Cancer Control Coordinating Committee (NCCCC).

As Dr. Dindial steps into this new role, he states:
